Dear Mr. Malatesta:

Advanced Waste Services of Indiana, Inc., is hereby issued solid waste facility permit FP 64-09, pursuant to IC 13-15-1-3 and 329 IAC 11-11-1. This approval is based on the processing facility permit application submitted to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), on September 14, 2006, and all subsequent amendments and addendums to the application, including: a site visit conducted on July 19, 2006; a request for additional information (RAI) response received December 27, 2006; and an RAI response received April 10, 2007. This permit issuance authorizes Advanced Waste Services of Indiana, Inc., to operate a solid waste processing facility (facility) and is subject to the terms of this letter and the enclosed requirements and conditions.

The solid waste facility referenced above is located at 5625 Old Porter Road in Porter County and contains approximately 8.56 acres located in a part of the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of section 11, township 36 north, range 7 west of the second principal meridian in the city of Portage, in Porter County, Indiana.

The solidification process facility includes the following: An administrative office, truck transportation services, loading/unloading areas, and a processing building for solid waste solidification. The processing building includes two in-ground pits for mixing solid waste with a solidification agent, an area around the pits for temporary storage of waste drums and containers, and a laboratory.

In accordance with 329 IAC 11-11-4, solid waste facility permit FP 64-09 does not authorize: any injury to any person or private property; the invasion of other private rights; the infringement of federal, state, or local laws or regulations; nor preempt any duty to comply with other state or local requirements.

IDEM may modify or revoke this permit in accordance with 329 IAC 11-11-6, and/or take enforcement action against the owner, operator, and/or permittee herein for failure to comply with the requirements and conditions of this permit.

In accordance with 329 IAC 11-11-1(c), this permit will not become effective until: (1) all financial responsibility documents have been executed and delivered to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) in the form and amount specified in this permit letter, and (2) any real estate transfers necessary to vest legal title of the real estate upon which the permitted activity is to occur in the name of the owner listed on the application have been completed, executed, and recorded and documents evidencing such transfer have been delivered to IDEM or proof of the applicant's agreement regarding the leasing of this property has been submitted to IDEM.

In accordance with 329 IAC 11-11-3, this permit is valid through July 1, 2012. To continue operation past this period, a renewal application in accordance with 329 IAC 11-9-4 must be submitted a minimum of one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the expiration date of the permit.

Pursuant to IC 4-21.5, a Petition for Review of this permit letter may be initiated by you, as applicant, or by an "aggrieved or adversely affected person". This permit becomes effective once all applicable time periods for petitioning for Stays of Effectiveness have expired, unless you are notified in writing by an Environmental Law Judge that the permit has been further stayed. As discussed in our enclosed Notice of Decision, if you wish to challenge this decision, you must file a Petition for Review with the Office of Environmental Adjudication within eighteen (18) days from the date that this permit letter was mailed, pursuant to IC 4-21.5-3-7.
